From Deacon Wigton Called to the Hard Road



James and John, the Sons of Thunder! Don't you wish you could find out what these Apostles had done to end up with such a nickname? Apparently, it might have been a

compliment Jesus bestowed on them because of their evangelical zeal. We get a taste of their personalities in today's Gospel where they are asking the Lord to be able to sit on His right and the other on His left when He is in Glory. Perhaps they should be applauded for their desire to be close to Jesus forever! This ambitious desire, however, gave Jesus a tremendous opportunity to teach the rest of the Apostles as well as all His followers through the ages who would reflect on this powerful biblical passage. James and John must have hung their heads and swallowed hard when they heard Jesus tell them that there is a cost of discipleship. Following Jesus could be the 'hard road'!

As disciples of Jesus, we have ambitions. One should be that we will be deemed great enough to be close to Jesus in all His Glory for eternity, perhaps even to the right or left of Saints James and John! Yet, these ambitions can get in the way of the sanctity necessary to attain that lofty goal. To be great in the sight of God is quite different than it is to be great in the world and in the eyes of men. To receive glory is not related to status and recognition or authority over others. It is rather in humility and service. To truly follow Jesus, we must do as He has done. He came "not to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:4)

The answer that Jesus gave to James and John is sobering! "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?" Quite glibly, they answered, "Yes, we can." How easy it is to be courageous when you don't know or see the giants that you will face. The brothers eventually learned what was being asked of them. John, the only apostle not to be martyred, was boiled in oil. James died by the sword at the demand of King Herod. (Acts 12:1) By the power of the Holy Spirit, they were able to carry out their conviction to truly follow Christ, to embrace His cross, and to drink the 'cup' that He would drink.

St. Augustine wrote: "To fall in love with God is the greatest romance: to seek Him the greatest adventure; to find Him, the greatest human achievement." What a thrill to find Jesus and to give your life to Him. There is no greater joy! When we have that 'come to Jesus' moment', little do we know what He plans to do with the life that we freely give Him. Perhaps we glibly can give our 'yes' to drinking the cup that He drinks and to be baptized with the baptism that He received. As convicted and courageous as we can be at the time we commit our lives to Him, we are powerless to carry it out without the help of His Holy Spirit. The giants are 'cunning, baffling, and powerful.' The accolades that we can receive from our peers and the glory that we get from the world constantly pull us away from the cross

that we are given by Our Lord and Master. The road the world offers us is so much easier, the burdens lighter. Discipleship is servanthood. The way is narrow, and the road is hard! It is humbling ourselves by placing the needs of others over our own. It is about leading but not about exerting authority over others. It is not about the honor of high places but about washing the feet of those God sends us to serve. It is about laying down our lives for our family, our neighbors, our friends, and even our enemies. We become agents for Jesus, sacrificing our lives for the marginalized, the forgotten, and the oppressed. It goes beyond the walls of our Church. It is out in a world that constantly entices us to receive its accolades that we instead choose to follow Jesus into the battle, only seeking peace and justice for all of God's children.

Like Saints James and John, ultimately, we only find Glory on the hard road!
