The Light of Christ

It was on the way to Damascus when it happened. Saul met Jesus, and his life was changed forever. He became supercharged with devotion to Jesus, his Savior, and became unstoppable. There wasn't a shipwreck, a scourging, a beating, or a stoning that could turn him back. He faced robbers, wild rivers, wilderness excursions, excruciating hardships, sleepless nights, hunger, thirst, and cold. Nothing could turn him back from what he describes as the "irrevocable call" he received when He met Jesus. The meeting was intense! So intense that the light blinded him, and he was knocked to the ground. The voice was unmistakable. "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" Saul turned from his severe persecution of Jesus and His followers to become what he called "the greatest of all the apostles." Saul, the stalwart persecutor, became Paul, the intrepid evangelist. He had a 'crazy love' for Jesus.

St. Paul has a word for us, a word written in the context of his love for Jesus and his hope that ours would be the same: "I urge you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer you bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourself to the age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." (Romans 12:1-2) In this gentle fashion, Paul is telling us something that he personally learned in blinding light and with a slam to the ground.

As we continue in this Lenten Season, are we conformed to this age? What are our values? There is a big world out there, constantly beckoning in irresistible fashion to embrace its values and trends. The world constantly lures us to live for the exhilaration of the moment. The next thrill! Bigger is better, and there is nothing like having more! Interestingly, the name Paul means 'humble' or 'small'. St Paul was the big guy with a retinue of henchmen who were his accomplices in his persecutions of Christians like St. Stephen, the first martyr. He went from proud and tough to humble and small. He was adulated by the world when he was the proud Saul. He is venerated by the Kingdom of God as the humble Paul! Pride literally went before his fall! When humbled, God could use him!

Something seems to happen when people see the light. Moses was not always a great prophet and leader. After killing an Egyptian, he fled from Pharaoh and Egypt to Midian. Just as God was able to find Saul, He found Moses in Midian. God presented Himself to him as light. The Light of the Most High came from a burning bush, one that was not being consumed. A voice came for the bush: "Moses, Moses, come no nearer! Remove your sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob". (Exodus 3:6-7) At this moment, Moses' life was changed. He was commissioned to lead the people of God to the promised land. The Light was life-changing. He would go anywhere and endure any hardship for God, who came as Light to the world.

In this journey through Lent, we are being prepared for something bigger than any of us. In the darkness of the Vigil Mass of Easter, 'the greatest and most noble of all Solemnities' a blazing fire is blessed, and from this fire, the Easter candle is lit while singing, "May the Light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds". There is a procession. The Easter Candle is held high. The Light of Christ is carried into the Church, dispelling darkness. The Light is passed from person to person until the Church is aglow with its brilliance. Now, we, too, become emissaries of the Light of Christ. We become leaders like Moses and Evangelists like St. Paul. Lent is a time to make us strong and humble enough to endure the hardships, the persecutions, the beatings, hunger, thirst, and cold that it may take to carry the Light of Christ into the world that is still looking for the next thrill. It is a time to make us fall crazily in love with Jesus! So much in love that we will proudly carry His light to every corner of darkness.
