

Our Lady Sunday



Rorate Coeli, desuper... Is 45:8 Let the Just One descend, O heavens, like dew from above, like gentle rain let the skies drop Him down. Let the earth open

and a Saviour bud forth.

Shame to shame. The bookends of Christmastide from Our Lady's perspective is the shame that she endured for us, to bring to us the glory of the Fruit of Her Womb. Mother of God, nowhere to rest her head, the world rejecting her and Him, no room in the Inn. Fast forward to Feb 2nd, 40 days after Christmas. The final whisps of Christmas explode into Candlemas -the Light to the Gentiles reaches its zenith. We hear the Christmas preface one more time, the Vatican takes down their Christmas tree, as will I and all who understand the importance of the 'ornamenting season' (clothe yourself with Christ Rom. 13). Feb 2nd is Sunday this year, so we will bless our +/- \$11,000 candle order for the year and do a procession. Right in the midst of all that, though, there is again 'shame' for Our Lady. Traditionally, Feb 2nd was the Purification of Our Lady. All women had to come to get purified after childbirth after 40 days and 'buy back' their child by offering a sacrifice (2 turtledoves for the poor).

I'm getting ahead of myself for the Season, but Our Lady did not need to be Purified. Thus, along with the supposed shame of no place in the Inn and the Purification, the glory of the *in partu* (the 'in the very act of birth' miraculous) virginity also bookends Christmas. When Half-Spent was the Night, the *in partu happened. Our Saviour was born from a Mother who remained physically intact at birth without any pain in the birth.* And 40 days later her *in partu* defined that she actually didn't need purification. But she submitted to that 'shame' as she did, going from door to door in Bethlehem. What a great model for us in our spiritual life. We give mercy as the world puts in our face the shame of the Cross and the ignominious death of our Savior. Such is the great life of a Christian!

A Merry Christmas when it *begins* in a few days! Dec 24, 4pm all clear to turn on the lights on your tree and yard as the *Light of the World* 'drops down from heaven.' Keep them on till Feb 2nd when the full glory of God manifests at Candlemas. *Ornament* your tree, or begin to as you begin to get ornamented by 'putting on Christ.' Manifest it to the world on 12th night! Epiphany. Bring it to the Gentiles in evangelization! Enjoy the joy which we now possess even as others despair that, once again, the Christmas Spirit didn't last. We've got to fill that gap before they despair. On the Feast of Stephen (Dec 26) we sing:

Good King Wenceslas **looked out**, on the Feast of Stephen, When the snow lay round about, deep and crisp and even; Brightly shone the moon that night, tho' the **frost was cruel**, When a poor man came in sight, gath'ring winter fuel. "**Hither, page**, and stand by me, if thou know'st it, telling, Yonder peasant, who is he? Where and what his dwelling?"... "Bring me flesh, and bring me wine, bring me pine logs hither: Thou and I will see him dine, when we bear them thither.".. "Sire, the night is darker now, and the wind blows stronger; Fails my heart, I know not how; I can go no longer." "Mark my footsteps, good my page. Tread thou in them boldly Thou shalt find the winter's rage freeze thy blood less coldly." In his master's steps he trod, where the snow lay dinted; Heat was in the very sod which the saint had printed. Therefore, Christian men, be

wealth or rank possessing, Ye who now will bless the poor, shall yourselves find blessing.

Let us discern well the deeper meaning of these words, our duties as Christians and God's love. Merry Christmas!
