

# From Deacon Wigton There is an iconic picture of 11 men sitting on an I-beam, high

over the city of New York during the construction of the Empire State building. The year was 1930. The world was in turmoil, devasted by the Great Depression. So many were out of work. These men and many others found work and were willing to take great risks to care for the financial needs of their families. The men on the beam represent a few of the many who contributed their unique skills and expertise to complete one of the greatest feats of human engineering as they collaborated on the creation of what was then the tallest building in the world. There were architects, steelworkers, masons, electricians, and many others who gave themselves to this task that became a beacon of hope to a troubled world. It was a testament to what could be achieved when there was unity and determination in a common mission. Against seemingly insurmountable obstacles, the men and women worked tirelessly. Because they were unified in their efforts, it was accomplished in a 'highly choreographed' work sequence that allowed them to complete the 102-story project in one year and 45 days! This historical achievement mirrors the message found in 1 Corinthians 12:12 regarding the Church: "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit, we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – we were all made to drink of one Spirit". Like the Empire State Building project, the Church is composed of many members, each with their own gifts and ministries. Every member has a special place and provides unique skills and gifts that are for the common good. With one unified mission, to spread the Good News of salvation, we can overcome seemingly insurmountable challenges. Led by the Spirit, the evangelistic project becomes highly choreographed maximizing our efforts. In the Gospel of today from Luke 4:18-21, Jesus quotes from Isaiah chapter 61 telling us that the project has begun: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Jesus goes on to say: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing"! Phenomenal things have taken place in the past 2000 years all because of the unique gifts followers of Jesus have given without reservation to the Church. The Good News of Salvation has spread to nearly every corner of the world. Literally billions of people have accepted Jesus as their Savior. Many have been willing to give everything they have to Him and perhaps given or risked their lives for the sake of His Gospel. We find ourselves now in a distinctive moment in time. Many

know Jesus and try to follow Him, but we are hardly unified in our efforts to serve Him. As of 2024 there were 45,000 Christian denominations in the world. We are separated by issues of doctrine and authority. The nature of Jesus, salvation, Apostolic succession, eschatology, conciliarity, papal supremacy, papal primacy, and the Eucharist are some of the points that keep us from being highly choreographed in our efforts to tell the world the Good News.

In 1995 Pope John Paul II wrote 'Ut Unum Sint' (That They May

Be One), an encyclical calling for a commitment to Ecumenism. He recognized the gravity of the disunity in the Church and the tremendous challenge that it posed. He understood that prayer and dialogue were central to bringing about unity. In way of exhortation, he wrote: "How is the Church to obtain this grace? In the first place, through prayer. Prayer should always concern itself with the longing for unity, and as such is one of the basic forms of our love for Christ and for the Father who is rich in mercy. In this journey which we are undertaking with other Christians towards the new millennium prayer must occupy the first place."

As we 'long for unity' perhaps today we can sit boldly and safely on the Church's I-Beam that

is held high over a world desperately needing Jesus and pray with confidence "Ut Unum Sint" That They May Be One.
